# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Federation's Annual General Meeting was held on Saturday 20 October in the Public Hall, North Cornelly, commencing at 2. 30pm, with 19 members present, representing 9 of our affiliated societies. Apologies for absence were received from Barbara Boscott, Brian Jones and Ken Reeves. Before the meeting commenced, members stood for a minute's silence in memory of President Shirley Baker of the Cardiff Society, who had sadly passed away in August.

In his first report as Chairman, Geoff Cooper (Swansea) thanked the officers and members for their support during the year, especially the members of the **Bridgend Society** for hosting a successful and enjoyable Autumn Day fair, and those involved in arranging the Annual Convention.

**Treasurer Colin Lewis** advised that the Federation was in a strong position financially, with an increase of £88.80 on the balance at 1 October 2011. He added that the cost of the hire of the Frincess Royal Theatre for the annual convention had increased, but that all expenditure was continually being monitored.

Youth Officer Erene Grieve reported that three schools had been visited in Wales, in Bridgend, Llanelli and Pembrey, If any member knew of a school in the region that might be interested in a visit, Erene would be happy to make contact. A Milford Haven Comprehensive School pupil, Rhys Evans, had won the British Young Stamp Collector Award, and was hoping to be invited to enter the International Exhibition in Malaysia in 2014.

Exchange Packet Organiser Reg Lyon advised that no real problems had been reported during the year, although some clubs were exceeding the one calendar month they were entitled to view any specific packet, which then had a knock-on effect later in the circuit.

The following members were elected to serve as Officers for the coming year: President, Charlie Williams (Curmarthen); Chairman, Geoff. Cooper (Swansea); Vice-Chairman, John Perry (Newport); Secretary. Neil Prior, (Port Talbot); Treasurer, Colin Lewis (Swansea); Exchange Packet Organiser. Reg. Lyon (Bridgend), and Youth Officer, Erene Grieve, (Haverfordwest), the only change being Charlie Williams replacing the late Shirley Baker.

Colin Lewis confirmed that the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention would be held on Saturday 18 May 2012 in the Princess Royal Theatre, PortTalbot, from 10.00am to 4.30pm.

Under Any Other Business, the Cardiff and Newport societies were to confer as to which of those clubs would host the 2013 Autumn Day Stamp and Postcard Fair.

Finally, all the proposed amendments to the Federation Constitution and the Exchange Packet Rules that had been circulated to all societies were agreed. #### WELSH PHILATELIC SOCIETY.

The Welsh Philatelic Society held its annual Autumn meeting on Saturday 3 November in the Lliedi Suite of the Selwyn Samuel Bowls Centre in Llunelli. The main morning display was provided by Roger Antell, who entertained members with a slide-show presentation on the "Waterford to Milford Haven Packet Service in the 19th Century", the subject of his book on the same topic which was published in 2011. After an excellent lunch, Gerald Marriner displayed part of his collection of Fishguard Postal History, together with other Pembrokeshire items. There were also mini-displays from Nigel McGaw, Neil Prior, Dan Jones, and Howard Jones.

If any member is interested in Welsh philately, posteards or postal history, this is **the** society to join, for a subscription of only £8.00 a year. For this paltry sum, you will receive three award-winning Newsletters (a Silver medal at this year's "Stampex" exhibition), the opportunity to bid at three postal/live auctions of Welsh material, and the chance to come to one of our meetings that are held at various venues in Wales.

#### GREAT BRITAIN STAMP ISSUES.

Now that details of this year's Christmas Stamps have been announced, a quick check of the cost for commemorative stamp issues for 2012 would have been in excess of £960, for a collector buying one of everything available – stamps, FDC's, Presentation Packs, PHQ Cards, Miniature Sheets, Prestige Booklets, etc., etc. In addition to this, there have been Smiler's Sheets, definitives, and Post & Go sets. Admittedly this was an exceptional year with all the Olympic and Paralympic Gold Medal issues, and if you really went to town with these, you could also collect the issues from each of the separate regional printers in London, Edinburgh, Preston, Swindon, Solihull, and Attleborough (Norfolk), but even so.....

The new Postal Museum will provide access to the BPMA's vast collections of photographs, posters, pillar boxes, vehicles and employment records.


### SWANSEA STAMP & POSTCARD FAIR.
