ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 2013.

The Annual General Meeting this year was held on Saturday 26 October at the Public Hall, Heol Las, North Cornelly. There were 17 members present, representing 9 societies, apologies having been received from Brian Jones (Lianelli), and Reg. Lyon (Bridgend). Members stood for a moments silence in memory of Gwen Hussey (Newport), and "Buster" Shimmen (Swansea).

The Federation Chairman, Geoff. Cooper (Swansea), thanked those members who had been involved in the organisation of both the annual convention and the "Autumn Day" events, the latter having been hosted by his own Swansea society.

Federation Treasurer, Colin Lewis (Swansea), presented the accounts for the year, which showed an overall loss of £165, adding that the Federation was, in effect, being run by the Convention surplus.

Exchange Packet Organiser Reg. Lyon (Bridgend), having submitted a written report, commented on the problem of blank spaces in some books, the receiving club not being aware whether there should be a stamp in that space on some occasions. Also, stamps should not be removed by the club owning a box before it goes on circuit, and clubs were reminded that one month was the time limit any club could retain a box.

The following members were elected to serve as Officers of the Federation for the coming year: President, Charlie Williams (Carmarthen); Chairman, (Geoff. Cooper (Swansea); Vice-Chairman, John Perry (Newport); Secretary, Neil Prior (Port Talbot); Treasurer, Colin Lewis (Swansea); Accounts Examiner, Charlie Williams (Carmarthen); Exchange Packet Organiser, Reg. Lyon (Bridgend, and Youth Officer, Erene Grieve (Haverfordwest).

In his first address as President, Charlie Williams, on behalf of all members, also thanked all those involved in the organisation of the Annual Convention and the "Autumn Day" Stamp & Postcard Fair. He added that the weather & the winter months might prevent him visiting the clubs further east. Finally, he congratulated our Youth Officer, Erene Grieve (Haverfordwest) on her receiving the British Museum & Archive Trust's National Volunteer Award for Museum Learning for 2012.

Neil Prior, in presenting the final report on the 2013 Convention, advised that the attendance was down from 156 to 128, and that some dealers were unhappy with their day, adding that if the trend continued, there was a danger to the event itself. He mentioned that it had cost over £870 to run the convention this year.

Colin Lewis confirmed that the 2014 Convention would be held on Saturday 17 May 2014, in the Princess Royal Theatre, Port Talbot.

John Perry (Newport) confirmed that the 2014 "Autumn Day" Stamp & Postcard Fair would be held on Saturday 20 September at the Graig Community Centre, Newport.

Roger Williams (Cardiff) commented on the Exchange Packet Circuits of 7 months (too long) and 5 months (too short), and wanted a return to the two circuits of 6 months. After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Executive Committee for further consideration.

If you still collect the current outflow of Great Britain new issues, and if you bought 1 of everything available eg. a set of stamps, Presentation Pack, First Day Cover, PHQ cards, etc., in 2013, you will have spent £508 on the commemorative issues alone, and this does not include any new Machin definitives, "Post & Go" items, "Smilers Sheets", etc. Bearing in mind that you are extremely unlikely to recoup more than 75% of your outlay when the time comes to sell.

Another interesting fact relates to the top value commemorative issued each year since decimalisation. A sample of the year's since shows that in 1971, this was 9p, in 1980 it was 50p, in 2000 this was 65p, in 2004 it had risen to £1.12, in 2010 it was £1.46, and in 2012 the top value was £1.90.

BRIAN CRIPPS.

Members will be saddened to learn that Brian Cripps of the Llanelli society passed away last month after a long illness. Brian, a native of Portsmouth, was a long-time member of Llanelli, holding most offices in that club, and had been Vice-Chairman of this Federation from 1979-1981, served as Chairman from 1981 to 1984, and was Federation President from 1986 until 2003, when a severe stroke curtailed his philatelic interests. He was also the author of several books on the postcards of Llanelli.

"POST & GO".

The final 2013 set of six "Post & Go" pictorial stamps were issued on 20 September, and was entitled "Freshwater Life".

For 2014, the theme will be Flora, with a seasonal twist. On 20 February, they will feature "Spring Blooms", and "Symbolic Flowers" will appear on 18 September, with "Winter Greenery" following on 13 November.

THE BRITISH POSTAL MUSEUM & ARCHIVE.

The BPMA's plans for a new postal museum are well developed, and are on target to open Calthorpe House in 2016. Incorporated in the plans will be permanent and temporary exhibition space, state-of-the-art research facilities, and an all-new purpose-built repository for the museum's collections.

There are also plans to open up parts of the old Post Office Underground Railway – Mail Rail, as an additional visitor experience. This will allow public access to the Mount Pleasant depot, and part of the original tunnels for the first time in the railway's 100-year history. The plan at the moment is for this to become fully operational by 2019,
