# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 2016.

In the morning session prior to the afternoon's Annual General Meeting, the eight members present were entertained by a series of mini displays of Canadian Railway Office postmarks, Monmouthshire Duplex datestamps, an auction purchase of Hungarian stamps/covers, Canadian Christmas Seals, Austria in Allied Occupation, 1935-1947, The Dell School one sheet competition entries, and the Americans in Thule, Greenland. With such diverse and interesting philatelic offerings, it is a great shame that more members don't attend these morning sessions.

After lunch, the Annual General Meeting commenced with 14 members representing 7 affiliated societies, with apologies having been received from Brian Jones, Mike Bates, & Keith Coles (all Llanelli), Martin Taylor & Glyn Attley (both British Rail), June Jones (Aberystwyth), Erene Grieve (Newport), Charlie Williams (Carmarthen), and Maureen Phillips (Bridgend). As the Minutes of The AGM has already been distributed to all societies, this is just a precis of those minutes. The Chairman, John Perry (Newport), thanked those who had helped with the organisation of the Convention and the Autumn Day, both held in Port Talbot He congratulated those who had entered the Federation Competition. He advised members present that the ABPS had arranged its Annual Congress in Cardiff in July 2017.

The Secretary, **Neil Prior (Port Talbot)** advised that he had only been able to issue two issues of the "Newsletter" due to holidays and other commitments. He felt that the electronic distribution of the Newsletter was responsible for the 1 entry only in the Christmas Competition instead of the usual 10+, and it was agreed that **1 paper copy** would be sent to each society and each officer in future.

Treasurer Colin Lewis (Swansea) presented the accounts for the year, which showed an overall surplus adding that a further £20 was the result of the sale, by auction, of philatelic material donated by various Philatelic Bureaux in previous years. Bev. Davies (Newport), the Federation Youth Officer, requested that some of the donated material be made available to the Youth groups, it being agreed that they have first refusal of any such items.

Exchange Packet Organiser Reg. Lyon (Bridgend) advised that, in Packet 72, an expensive mint stamp had been replaced by a cheap used example, and that the vendor was now supplying a photocopy of any expensive items, adding that if any members wished to buy the item, he should contact the Packet Secretary of the society concerned. He requested that club organisers and members be more vigilant when viewing any packet.

Youth Officer **Bev. Davies (Newport),** in her first report to the Federation, commented that there were now 7 clubs in Pembrokeshire, and 1 in Chepstow, with all clubs doing well with entries at "Stamp Active", 1 one-page entry being judged "Best in Show" at "Stampex", one 12-year old gained 1<sup>st</sup> prize at the British Youth Championships, and an 18-year old received a Bronze at New York 2016.

The following were elected to serve as Officers of the Federation for the coming year: President - Charles Williams (Carmarthen); Chairman - John Perry (Newport); Vice-Chairman - Paul Clarke (Cardiff); Secretary - Neil Prior (Port Talbot); Treasurer - Colin Lewis (Swansea); Exchange Packet Organiser - Reg. Lyon (Bridgend), and Youth Officer - Bev. Davies (Newport).

# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2016 - continued.

In his report on the 2016 Convention, **Neil Prior (Port Talbot)** confirmed that attendances had marginally increased, and that whilst some dealers were happy with their day, some would not be returning in 2017. There was a total of **seven** entries in the senior competitions and **nine** juniors. There was an increase in the income from the programme adverts, and the raffle raised £227+. For the first time an advert had been placed in the **South Wales Evening Post** at a cost of £108, adding the it cost around £900 to run the Convention this year. Reference was made to the previous years meeting and the discussion regarding an alternative convention venue, the Chairman adding that unless here was an organisation in place to run a Convention at another venue, it was a non-starter.

Colin Lewis (Swansea) advised members present that the 48th Annual Convention would be held on SATURDAY 20 May in The Princess Royal Theatre, Civic Centre, Port Talbot SA13 1PJ, adding that, to date, 13 dealers had reserved table space, including 1 new dealer.

Under Any Other Business, the proposal from the Newport club that The Federation Competition entries be provided by societies as colour copies, not as originals, with the society supplying the entries signing to confirm that the original entries are the work and property of the entrant" was discussed, and after comments by several members, the proposal was rejected.

The Secretary advised that only one application had been received (from the Newport Society) to organise the 2017 "Autumn Day" Stamp & Postcard Fair, and that this would be held on SATURDAY 23<sup>rd</sup> SEPTEMBER 2017 at the Graig Community Centre, Bassaleg, the same venue as in 2014.

# THE WELSH POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY.

The Society held another successful meeting on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> November in the Selwyn Samuel Bowls Centre, LLANELLI, when the main displays were provided by Neil Prior with "A Postal History of the Swansea Valley", and Charlie Williams with a postcard display entitled "A Walk Through Carmarthen". These were supported by mini-displays by several members, and Society Archivist Prof. Cedric Prys-Roberts gave members an update on the proposed new Society website.

If any member of a society within the Federation is interested in any aspect of Welsh philately, postal history or postcards they would surely benefit from membership, and should contact the Secretary, Neil Prior for further information.

# GREAT BRITAIN STAMP PROGRAMME.

At present the Royal Mail's programme of new stamp issues for 2017 is yet to be announced in the philatelic press, apart from the first issues on 17 January, entitled "Ancient Britain", consisting of four se-tenant pairs of 1<sup>st</sup> Class, £1.05, £1.33, and £1.52, a total face value of £9.08.

As far as the 2016 Programme was concerned, if you bought one of everything on each of the 14 new issues, a set of stamps, Presentation Pack, First Day Cover, Coin Cover, PHQ Cards, etc, etc, this would have cost you £593. 94, and this does not include booklets, new Machins, "Smilers" sheets, and "Post & Go" labels, and any other tempters that Royal Mail can think up to part you with your hard-earned money!!

# ABPS NEWS.

In "ABPS NEWS", it has been announced that the popular "MIDPEX" exhibition and Stamp Fair, held every two years, will be held on SATURDAY 8 JULY, at the Warwickshire Exhibition Centre, near Leamington Spa.

It is proposed to hold a revived Inter-Federation Competition during "Autumn Stampex" in September 2017, provided at least 6 Federations take part. This Federation was successful in winning this competition many years ago, when David Gwynn, Howard Warren and myself combined to put together a 64-page entry on "A Postal History of Swansea".

It was reported in the "Winter2016" issue that Toby Asson, Joseph Likeman, Carys Llewellyn (best overall exhibit), and Sara Llewellyn of the Haverfordwest junior clubs all won awards at the British Youth Stamp Championships.




# CHRISTMAS COMPETITION.
