48th ANNUAL CONVENTION - 2017.

Our 48th Annual Convention will be with us next month, and will be held on SATURDAY 20 MAY in THE PRINCESS ROYAL THEATRE, CIVIC CENTRE, PORT TALBOT, SA13 1PJ, from 9.30am to 4.30pm, admission being 50p.

The Official Opening Ceremony will be performed by the Mayor of Neath Port Talbot, Cllr. Sheila Penry at 12.00 noon, and this will be followed by the Presentation of Awards, and the Raffle Prize Draw. Please note that parking outside the Theatre is now chargeable, at £3.00 for over 4 hours, and teas/coffees, etc. will be available in the hall. For those requiring something more substantial, there are a number of cafes, restaurants and pubs within a short walk, and for more detailed information, check at the Federation Table in the hall.

The new dealers this year are Alf Reynold-Williams and Martin Whybrow.

The Convention Programme, free on admission, contains all you need to know about the various attractions inside the hall, as well as information on the South Wales Federation and the affiliated societies. The Annual Competition entries are listed, and will be displayed on the stage. I would urge you to check on the entries in the junior classes, to see that the hobby is still alive and kicking with the children. Raffle Tickets will be on sale at the admission desk and in the hall, the draw being held at around 12.30pm.

The Annual Convention is one of only TWO DAYS in the year (the "Autumn Day" being the other) when the Federation asks for the active support and physical presence of its members. This Means YOU!!! So please, make every effort to come along to The Princess Royal Theatre in Port Talbot on SATURDAY 20 MAY, even if it's only for an hour or so, as the attendance over the past few years has been extremely disappointing. Another downward trend in attendance could mean the loss of our Convention in its present form, the only Stamp and Postcard Fair of its kind in Wales.

You never know, you might find that elusive stamp, cover or postcard you've spent years searching for lurking in one of the dealers stockbooks or boxes, just waiting for YOU to come along and find it. If you don't come, you'll have no chance at all!!

THE WELSH POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY.

The Society held a very successful meeting in Aberystwyth in March, when the main topic for the day was postal History related to "Worthies of Cardiganshire and Merionethshire".

The Society will be holding its 41st consecutive residential weekend at the Snowdonia National Park Study Centre, "Plas Tan y Bwlch", near Porthmadog, from Friday 16 June to Sunday 18 June. Aside from the Annual General Meeting, the attractions will include a light-hearted (but keenly fought) "Egg-cup" competition, a live/postal auction of Welsh postcards and postal history, and several dealers are usually present with their stocks to browse through, and there will be displays by Roger Broomfield on "Welsh Neighbours", Cedric Prys-Roberts on "The postal history of Wrexham and the surrounding area. In addition, there will be a joint presentation by members present on "Welsh Maritime Mail".

For anyone interested in any aspect of Welsh philately, postal history or postcards, this is **the** Society to join, at an annual fee of just £9.00. For this modest sum, you will receive three award-winning "Newsletters" each year, containing articles on matters Welsh, the chance to bid for items to enhance your collection, and the opportunity to attend any or all of the meetings of the society, currently being held in Conwy, Llanelli, Aberystwyth, and, of course, "Plas Tan y Bwlch".

"AUTUMN DAY" STAMP & POSTCARD FAIR.

The Newport club will be hosting the 39th annual "Autumn Day" Stamp & Postcard Fair on SATURDAY 23 SEPTEMBER 2017 from 10.00am to 4.00pm, in the GRAIG COMMUNITY CENTRE, Caerphilly Road, Newport, NP10 8LG. This is the same venue as in 2014.

The venue is 1 mile from Junction 28 of the M4, has free parking, and refreshments will be available. As usual, there will be the usual mix of dealers and society tables to search through for a bargain, and for items to enhance your collection.

SPRING & SUMMER POSTCARD FAIRS.

During the coming months there are a number of Stamp & Postcard Fairs around the country, and those of you taking holidays or long weekends might be able to visit one or more of these during your breaks. The main fairs to consider, in addition to our own **Annual Convention in Port Talbot on 20 May**, are:

"WORPEX".

To be held on Saturday 13th May from 10.00am to 4.00pm at the Tudor Grange Academy, Bilford Road, WORCESTER, WR3 8HN. This is close to Junction 6 on the M5. There are usually 40+ dealers, with refreshments available and free admission, a free programme, and free but limited car parking. There is also a free shuttle bus service, and for more information, go to www.worpex.com.

"SWINPEX".

Another popular one-day fair, to be held on Saturday 10th June from 10.00am to 4.30pm at St. Joseph's Catholic College, Ocotal Way, SWINDON, SN3 3LR. There will be around 46 dealers attending, with some 12 specialist societies holding morning and afternoon meetings. Light refreshments are available, and there is ample free parking. and admission is £1.00 by programme.

"MIDPEX".

Held every two years, this popular and well-attended fair will be held on Saturday 8th July at the Warwickshire Exhibition Centre, Fosse Way, LEAMINGTON SPA, CV31 1XN. Although an out of town venue, and difficult to find, there is ample free parking. There are usually about 70 dealers present, in addition to the 40+ specialist societies taking advertising frames and tables, including our own Welsh Postal History Society. YORK.

Arguably the best Stamp & Postcard fair outside London, this two-day event will be held on Friday 21st and Saturday 22nd July at the York Racecourse Grandstand, with free admission and ample car parking. There are usually around 100 dealers (plus 50 coin & banknote dealers) present. There is also the historic city of York, with its many attractions, making this a great place to spend a weekend or more, there is so much to see in the city and surrounding countryside.

PORTISHEAD.

A popular fair for collectors from south Wales, I believe that this Stamp & Postcard Fair will be held at the Gordano Comprehensive School, St. Mary's Road, Portishead, BS20 7QR, on Saturday 12 August, although this date has yet to be confirmed.
