ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

In the morning session prior to the afternoon's Annual General Meeting, the eight members present were entertained by a series of mini-displays of a miscellany of postcard rates and uses, Egyptian stamps & proofs, Philatelic Congress souvenirs, Cardiff Philatelic Congress 2017, and postcards from the late Victorian period. In addition, Colin Lewis showed his 16-sheet winning entry (in the Canadian P. S. of G.B. competition) of Newfoundland, and Bev. Davies showed the winning entry from **The Dell school in Chepstow** in the Spring "Stampex 2017" competition, winning a silver-gilt medal.

After a break for lunch, the Annual General Meeting commenced with the Chairman, John Perry (Newport), in the chair. There was a disappointing 13 members present, representing 7 societies. Prior to the start of the meeting, members held a minute's silence in memory of Geoff. Cooper (Swansea), Alan Rosser (Barry), both past chairmen of the Federation, and Glyn Attley (British Rail).

As the official Minutes of the meeting have already been distributed to all officers and societies, this is just a precis of those minutes, highlighting the main points from the meeting. The Chairman, **John Perry**, thanked all those members who had helped with the organisation of the Convention (in Port Talbot) and the Autumn Day (in Newport).

The Secretary, Neil Prior (Port Talbot) advised that he had only been able to circulate two issues of the "newsletter" again, due to holidays and other commitments, and that he would have to give consideration to changing the dates of issue next year.

The Treasurer, Colin Lewis (Swansea) presented the accounts for the year, which showed an overall LOSS of £66 from 2016, adding that he thought that the coming year might also prove difficult. After some discussion, it was decided to increase to Society Annual Subscription from £5.00 to £10.00.

The Youth Officer, Bev. Davies (Newport) advised that youth philately continued to flourish in south and west Wales, advising that Carys Llewellyn)Haverfordwest) had been the overall winner in the British Youth Championships.

The following were elected to serve as Officers of the Federation for the coming year: President – Charles Williams (Carmarthen); Chairman - Chris Griffiths (Bridgend); Secretary – Neil Prior (Port Talbot); Treasurer – Colin Lewis (Swansea); Exchange Packet Organiser – Reg Lyon (Bridgend), and Youth Officer – Bev. Davies (Newport). For the first time, we have no Vice-Chairman nominated, as last year's Vice-Chairman submitted his resignation a week before the meeting.

In his report on the 2017 Convention, **Neil Prior** confirmed that the attendance had marginally increased, and that some dealers reported on a good day, whilst others were not so happy and would not be returning in 2018. The senior competitions continued to disappoint, with only **5 entries**, but there were a record **14 entries** from the juniors.

Colin Lewis advised that the 2018 Convention would be held on Saturday 19 May, in the Princess Royal Theatre, Port Talbot, from 9.30am to 4.30pm.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - CONTINUED.

Under any other Business, the proposal received from the Swansea Society that the Federation Competition Rules for the Great Britain Class be amended to include Mint Postal Stationery was agreed, Neil Prior explaining that the last entry received in this class was in 2006, and that it was hoped that this extension might bring in an entry or two. He added that used postal stationery would continue to be entered in the Postal History class.

Neil Prior advised that no applications had been received to host the 2018 "Autumn Day" Stamp & Postcard Fair. On behalf of the Swansea society, Colin Lewis added that he had made enquiries in Swansea, but that there was no suitable venue in the city. Bev. Davies volunteered the Newport society again if no other club came forward, although it was unusual for the event to be hosted by the same club on successive years.

The Treasurer, Colin Lewis commented on the tight schedule between the end of our Financial year on 30 September and the date of the Annual General Meeting in October. After some discussion on various points raised, it was agreed to change the end of the Federation's Financial Year to 31 July, and it was noted that the next Financial Year would be of 10 months, but that the Annual General Meeting would still be held in October as per the Constitution.

OBITUARY.

Alan Rosser.

Members will be saddened to learn that Alan passed away on Sunday 15 October, the day after the Barry Stamp & Postcard Fair. Alan was Chairman of the Federation from 2006 to 2008, and Vice-Chairman before that. He had also served the Barry club in various capacities over many years, latterly as Secretary and Exchange Packet Secretary, and will be sorely missed by the club.

THE WELSH POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY.

The society held another successful annual south Wales meeting on Saturday 4 November in The Selwyn Samual Bowls Centre in Llanelli, when the main displays were by Howard Jones, who showed part of his collection of Carmarthen Postal History, and Neil Prior, who displayed some of the postal history of the Bridgend Postal District. These were supported by mini-displays by other members present.

The annual subscription is a very modest £9.00, the price of a decent postcard these days.

The Programme for 2018 has yet to be announced, but don't be surprised if it contains more rubbish issues to milk some of you GB collectors of your hard-earned salary or pension.

THE NATIONAL POSTAL MUSEUM.

The new National Postal Museum was opened to the public on FRIDAY 28 JULY. I gather from Colin Lewis, who paid a visit there shortly after it opened, that it is well worth a visit when you're in London, maybe combined with a "Stampex" visit. Ceremonially opened by the Princess Royal on 13 June, the Museum is located in Phoenix Place, Clerkenwell, London.

Adult entry tickets cost £16.00, including an optional donation of £1.50. One attraction is a ride on "Mailrail", the miniature underground railway system that formerly carried mail under the busy London streets. For further information, visit www.postalmuseum.org.


